GOAL 14: LIFE BELOW WATER

A. General Statistics

- i. Pakistan has 990 kilometers long coastline, bifurcated in two parts, Sindh coast 270 km and Makran coast 720 km.¹
- ii. The Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) of Pakistan covers an area of about 240,000 sq. km.²
- iii. The maritime zone of Pakistan, including the continental shelf, extends up to 350 nautical miles from the coastline.³
- iv. The Port of Karachi is one of South Asia's largest and busiest deep-water seaports, handling about 70% of the nation's cargo (25 million tons per annum) located in Karachi, Pakistan.⁴
- v. During the year 2019-20 (July-March), a total quantity of 133,226 metric tonnes of fish and fishery products valued \$ 317.307 million (Rs. 49,528 million) were exported.⁵
- vi. Gwadar Deep Water Port has been constructed as the third port of Pakistan. Situated on the Balochistan coast, it is about 460 km away from Karachi and 120 km from the Iranian border.⁶
- vii. Pakistan ranks 222nd global ocean health index.⁷
- viii. 350 million gallon/day raw sewage and untreated industrial waste flows into the Arabian sea from Karachi.⁸
- ix. During 2020-21 (July-March), total marine and inland fish production was estimated at 690.600metric tonnes.⁹
- x. Fish production in FY2020 (July-March) was 701.726 thousand metric tonnes in which 474.025 thousand metric tonnes was from marine and the remaining from the inland fishery sector. The production of fish & fishery products has witnessed a decreased of 1.5%.¹⁰
