GOAL 2: ZERO HUNGER

A. General Statistics

- i. Pakistan ranks 80th out of 113 countries on Global Food Security Index.¹
- ii. 12.9% people out of total population are undernourished.²
- iii. More than $1/3^{rd}$ of the whole population i.e. 36.9% is food insecure.³
- iv. Pakistan ranks 2nd highest in the region with 17.7% of the children suffering from acute malnutrition.⁴
- v. An average Pakistani household spends almost 50.8% of its monthly income on food related expenses.⁵
- vi. Out of total area of Pakistan 79.61 million hectors, only 22 million hectors are cultivated lands which constitute the 27.6% of the total land.⁶
- vii. Share of agriculture in total employment is 37.4% which is lower than last reading/figure of 43.5% in 2010-2011.⁷
- viii. 42 districts (19 in Balochistan, 13 in Sindh, 7 in KP and 3 in Punjab) have high recurrence of vulnerability to food insecurity coupled with high or medium levels of natural hazards.⁸
- ix. High levels of malnutrition lead to low workforce productivity, costing Pakistan USD 7.6 billion, or 3% of its Gross Domestic Product (GDP), every year. 9
